Confessions of a Closet Ft-8'er

Confessions of a Closet FT-8'er!

I admit it, I'm a analog guy in a digital world. I still consider Morse Code as the original digital format (tip of the hat to San, YY)! I never was interested in any of the digital modes used in amateur radio. I can remember struggling through a Fortran programming course at the Signal Officers' Advanced Course at Fort Monmouth in 1972. None of this stuff for me! Hey, today if I have an issue with my Mac or I-phone, I let my grandson (age 12) fix it. But I digress.... fast forward to 2017. Visiting my friend George, WB5XX, in El Dorado, I was impressed at all the DX he was working on FT-8. But my operating times in Albuquerque were limited to chasing interesting DX in the Pacific region, planning my annual DX trip, or operating mobile for county and/or POTA chasers.

But something about FT-8 intrigued me. I went back and read about it. George continued to encourage me and I finally relented and decided to give it a go. It did require some investment on my part. I bought a new Icom 7300 as it had all the bells and whistles required for FT-8. I bought a used PC since the FT-8 program apparently is much easier to install with Windows (remember I'm computer illiterate!). Our resident FT-8 expert, John, WB5BHS, was pestered with lots of questions and always provided cheerful help and guidance.

After getting it all sorted out, I got on the air on December 27, 2017. The first contact (and DX) was PY2FQR. Second contact (and first state) was AG2J in New Jersey. My goal was to work WAS with just casual operating. I was surprised to work WAS in 16 days with the last state being WR8O in Wyoming. By that time I had also worked 28 DXCC entities. But I was hooked - although watching the screen is sort of like watching paint dry. Certainly not a social means in the ways of amateur radio.

I started checking the band in the morning and late afternoon. My antenna farm consists of a single band dipole configured as an inverted V with the apex about 35 feet up on a flat roof. So whenever I want to change bands, I have to take out the ladder and change the dipole. Pathetic, but it is what it is hi.....

Slowly the DXCC totals mounted: # 50 V2PE on February 25, 2018; # 75 CP1XRM on June 21, 2018; and # 90 YJOGA on July 20, 2018. The final 10 took around six months - #95 VP6D on October 24, 2018. Finally... #100 GD0TEP on January 17, 2019!

91 DXCC entities have been confirmed on LOTW with 9 more confirmed with paper QSLs. One day I'll get around to applying for DXCC.....

Interesting QSLs include: KH1/KH7Z, VR2KW, HS0ZIV, 3D2TS, J35X, OD5YA, XP3A, S01WS, 9M2MRS, VP8NO, EW8W, VP6D, BD3PXM, and SV9CVY.

No, it's not like listening to a station coming back with Arctic flutter on 20 CW... but it's still a thrill to see your call flashing on the screen coming back from some faraway QTH.

I know some of the ADXA "Big Guns" could probably work 100 in a couple of weeks. But I hope this will encourage some other "Little Pistols" to give FT-8 a try in these terrible solar conditions.

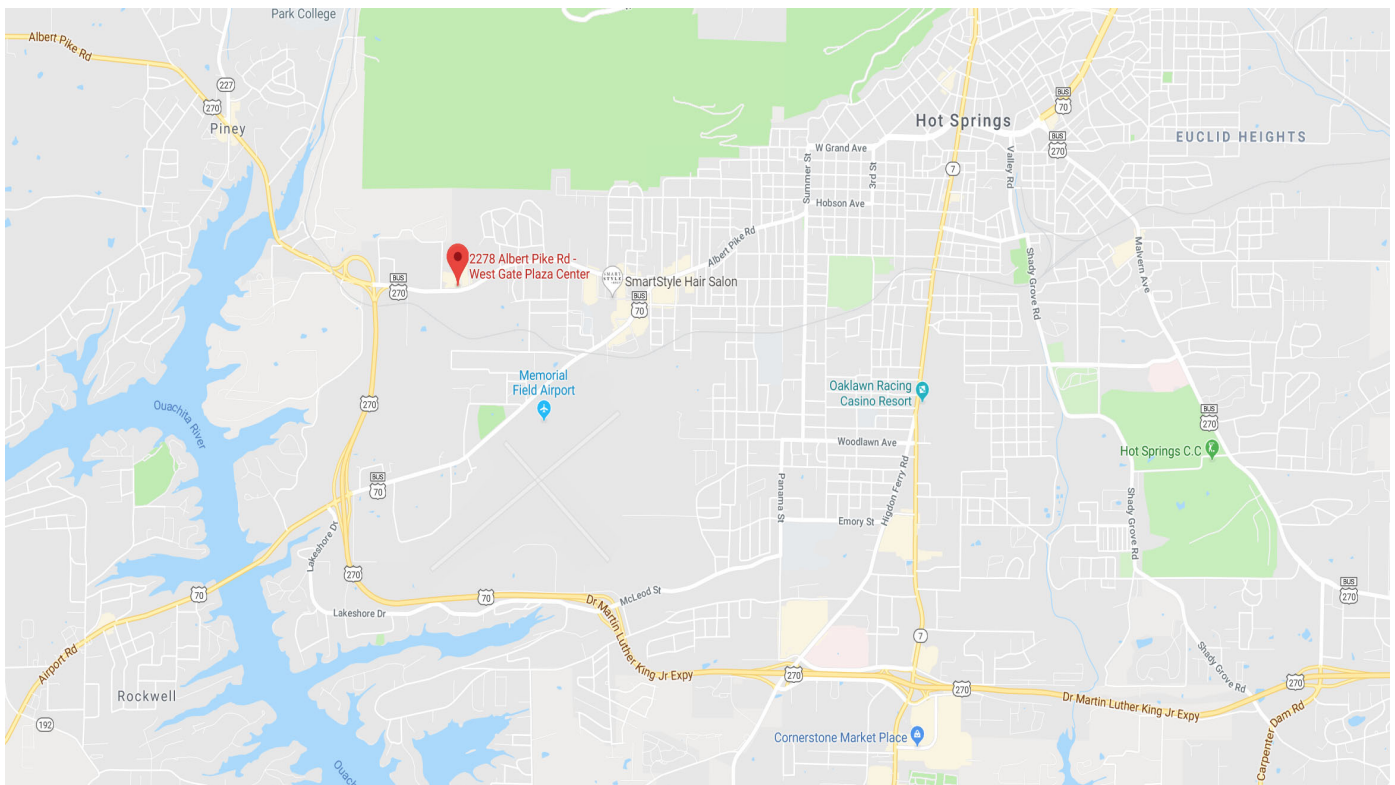
