

PUBLIC SERVICE EVENTS

The Alexandria Radio Club (ARC) participates in a number of public service events each year. These activities allow club members to activate and maintain their radio operator skills while serving public interests.

ANNUAL ARRL FIELD DAY

ARRL Field Day is ham radio's open house and is conducted in late June every year with over 40,000 hams throughout North America. It allows ham radio operators to test their "field" emergency communications skills and it serves to raise public awareness about the amateur radio service in the Alexandria community.

GEORGE WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY PARADE

Every year ARC supports the George Washington Birthday Parade sponsored by the City of Alexandria. It provides radio communications support to help keep track of parade staging and order of march, while practicing radio operator skills.

ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

ARC has supported the St. Patrick's Day parade in Alexandria providing a float, the Club's emergency communications trailer, which exhibits portable ham radio capabilities for City emergency communications.

MARINE CORPS MARATHON

Annually, ARC joins with other ham radio clubs in the DC Metro area to support the Marine Corps Marathon. During this event, over 100 hams become the "eyes and ears" on the marathon route, paying close attention to the health and condition of runners. This information is reported by radio to the Medical Department of the Navy, which handles emergency medical support for the race.

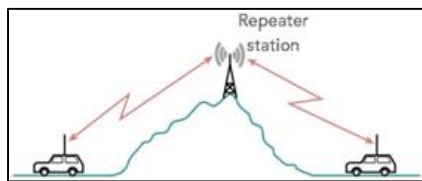
WHAT IS HAM RADIO?

Amateur Radio (ham radio) is a popular hobby and service that brings people, electronics and communication together. Hams are required to be licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). People use ham radios to talk across town, around the world, or even into space, all without the Internet or cell phones; it is fun, and it works in emergencies. Ham radio equipment can consist of a handy-talkie, portable equipment, or extensive fixed station equipment.



CLUB REPEATERS

ARC has the most amateur radio repeaters operating in the DC/Metro area. These 10 repeaters provide club members with excellent opportunities for a wide variety of technical experiences and flexibility. They also provide redundancy across the City of Alexandria in case of emergencies.

TRAINING AND FCC LICENSE EXAMINATIONS

ARC conducts FCC license classes for the Technician Class in the spring and fall of each year. The classes are 10 weeks long and they are designed to teach fundamentals of ham radio for passing the FCC examination. ALEXANDRIA RADIO CLUB

Founded in 1954, the Alexandria Radio Club (ARC) has been a model of service to the Alexandria community for 65 years, proudly representing amateur radio throughout the DC Metropolitan area. On its 65th Anniversary In 2019, ARC was recognized by the City of Alexandria and Virginia Senator Mark Warner for service to the community. ARC became affiliated with the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) in 1966 and has promoted the aims and policies of the ARRL since that time.

ARC has an affiliated ARRL Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) body of club members that is organized to provide emergency communications for the City of Alexandria in case of emergencies or disasters.

FIELD DAY

Every year a public exhibit of ARC emergency communications skills and abilities is conducted in the local area on ARRL Field Day, the fourth full weekend in June.
