## President's Corner

**F**ellow Members and Radio Enthusiasts, we've arrived at the end of another successful year in the Alexandria Radio Club. This will be my last newsletter column as your Club President so I wanted to take this opportunity to let you know what a pleasure and a privilege it has been to be your President for the past two years. While we were not able to accomplish all we had set out to do, we did make some important gains.

One of my two primary focus areas was to create opportunities for trained, licensed and equipped amateur radio operators to use their equipment and get on the air. We supported City events such as the George Washington and St.

Patrick's Day Parades Order of March details, the D-Day remembrance, and National Night Out, as well as providing communications support for the Marine Corps Marathon. We also participated in Tons of Trucks—a large scale social outing setup to display the City's fleet of large equipment, which also served as a meet and greet with City Public Safety Officials. We also created opportunities to provide direct support for Office of Emergency Management exercises and real-world events as required. We made some unplanned in-roads with the DC Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency while planning and supporting communications watch for the January Inauguration and State of the Union speech. An amateur radio relationship with DC HSEMA is important if ARC wants to participate in national special security events (NSSE), as DC HSEMA is the lead for federal events in DC and they now welcome the professional support they receive from their closest neighbor south of the river. All these events are in addition to the regular annual events we service under the ARRL banner, such as Winter Field Day and Field Day.

My other primary focus area was to extend and strengthen the ARC relationship with the City of Alexandria. I believe we have achieved this goal, as we are soon to be named as a Charter Member to one of the more critical City Commissions, the Citizens Corps Council (CCC). This council, overseen directly by two members of City Council, supports the enhancement of City preparedness and the coordination of volunteer engagement in response to any disaster impacting the City or its residents. We join other recognized groups as a part of the CCC, including the American Red Cross, Virginia Dept. of Health/Medical Reserve Corps (MRC), Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), the Alexandria Federation of Civic Associations, and Volunteer Alexandria, the City's volunteer management element. The CCC is facilitated by the City's Office of Emergency Management, who is our sponsor for all City resources and requests. Our primary task in this mission is to develop and assist in training and exercising communications capabilities and facilitate operational deployments between disparate volunteer organizations servicing the City who are not licensed as amateur radio operators. In 2025, ARC, as a part of CCC, was invited by the Office of Emergency Management to attend the reading of the Proclamation supporting Emergency Preparedness Month in the City Council chambers with the Mayor and the City Manager present. This was a great public relations moment for the Alexandria Radio Club.

From a regional amateur radio perspective, we were also able to increase our participation in joint events with the Arlington Amateur Radio club while working POTA/Day in the Park events and we provided support to the Boy

Scouts Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) event as well. Perhaps next year we can add some joint engagements with the Mount Vernon Club.

I anticipate that we will finally achieve our tax free/donor friendly status next year and one of the immediate benefits of that reclassification is the ability to secure both Enterprise Office software and substantial Cloud storage at no cost from Google and/or Microsoft. This will enable ARC to establish its records, member applications, contracts and other critical documents in an indexed secure digital environment. No more lost or damaged paper records in boxes in member basements, garages and storage units!

Now to the most important component of the Alexandria Radio Club: YOU, our members. Without active, engaged, creative, thinking and dedicated members, none of the above activities or events would be possible. So, to all of you that have contributed your time, expertise, talent, or otherwise supported Club activities, I would like to extend a heartfelt Thank You! You are the lifeblood of a Club that keeps on getting better and better. As we get set to enter our 72<sup>nd</sup> year of operation, I would ask that you continue to participate in our activities or maybe step up and engage if you haven't in the past. Please support our new officers in their mission to shepherd the club forward and support the Committee Chairs in their focus areas. If you have some ideas about activities or events that you would like to see the Club become active in, please bring them to a membership meeting or submit them to the Committee Chairs or the Club leadership to see how your ideas can be accommodated.

I hope to see many of you at the Christmas Party at Aldo's on Friday. I should be a great affair! I've already got my Secret Santa gift ready to go!

## Last Meeting

**Date:** November 14, 2025

**Time:** 1900 hours

**Location:** Community Room at the Alexandria Police Headquarters Building, 3600 Wheeler Avenue

1. For the November 14<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Alexandria Amateur Radio Club, 31 people were in attendance, with 29 people in-person with 2 people participating in the online zoom meeting.
2. The meeting began with the election committee directed by Gary Sessums, KC5QCN, handing out ballots for election of club officers for 2026. The election ballot for 2026 included the open positions for president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer and one board of directors

slot. The only contested position was for the president position between Aaron Kahn, K6HLC, and Erik Misavage, KI4BXU. All other positions were uncontested, including Skip Dronen, KO2THF, for vice president, Michael Joyce, KQ4WOI, for secretary, Richard Morani, KW4UJ, for treasurer, and Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, for board of directors. For the president's office, Aaron Kahn, K6HLC, received 20 votes while Erik Misavage, KI4BXU, received 8 votes. Aaron Kahn, K6HLC is the 2026 club president. A total of 28 ballots were distributed for the election at the meeting.

3. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, discussed edits to be made to the October meeting minutes. Jack York, KE7VOU, gave the post office box key to the incoming secretary, Michael Joyce, KQ4WOI.
4. Richard Morani, KW4UJ, gave the treasurer's report with a total balance of around \$12,000 for all accounts with total charges of around \$1,600 for October.
5. Jan Maas, KB2LRX, discussed that not all club members received the October 2025 ARC-SHORTS, the club monthly newsletter, via email. In addition, he noted club member participation in the Scouting Jamboree event on the 18<sup>th</sup> of October and the Marine Corps Marathon.
6. Ian Keith, N8IK, stated all club repeaters are working.
7. Sandy Kenyon, KQ4DNE, mentioned that people interested in participating in ARES and other emergency communications activities can take required ICS classes online at the FEMA website. Jan Maas, KB2LRX, and Stefano Fonda, K4IEW, mentioned emergency communications articles in the October ARC-SHORTS.
8. Richard Morani, KW4UJ, discussed that no fall license classes are being held because of lack of people registering for the class. Gary Sessums, KC5QCN, discussed the need for more volunteer examiners for VE sessions. In addition, Gary Sessums made the recommendation of exam preparation cram sessions that only last a few days as an alternative to the club's exam license classes that last several weeks as a means of increasing participation in club license exam preparation activities.
9. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, mentioned that the trailer will be cleaned for the next event in 2026, the February President's Day Parade in Alexandria.
10. Richard Morani, KW4UJ, discussed plans to add a new membership application form on the club's website that will be connected to the club

membership database. Plans also include the addition of a members-only section to the website.

11. Jan Maas, KB2LRX, discussed the club's social media websites are operational including Discord and Face Book. Michael Joyce, KQ4WOI, the incoming secretary, has been adding events to the club's Discord server website.
12. Brian Pettigrew, WD4ADF, discussed recent net control operator classes and the lack of volunteers for weekly club repeater nets. Special event nets on bands such as 70cm, 1.25 meters, and 10 meters will need more volunteers. In November and December, fewer nets are scheduled on Wednesdays (D-Star) and Thursdays (2 meters) because of the holidays.
13. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, discussed the need for a new Field Day director for 2026.
14. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, discussed the old business item of the approval of the club's application for tax exempt 501.c.3 status with the IRS and the modification of the articles of incorporation with the state of Virginia.
15. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, discussed the new business item of the assignment of club officers to positions that represent the club to federal and state government agencies and ARRL committees. Skip Dronen, KO2THF, the incoming vice-president, will be the club's trustee to the state of Virginia Corporation Commission. Aaron Kahn, K6HLC, the incoming club president, will be the club's trustee to the FCC. The plan is for these representative positions to be rotated between club members every two years
16. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, discussed the club's upcoming holiday dinner on December 12<sup>th</sup> at Aldo's Italian Kitchen located at 2850 Eisenhower Ave in Alexandria, VA 22314.
17. Louis Mingo, KO4QVB, discussed club merchandise that includes hats and shirts, which is available for order in the members-only section of the club website.
