THE ART OF ELECTRONIC KEYING:

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Letters, punctuation, and prosigns that a dual lever paddle and lambic Mode B can help automate: C K N R F L Q Y . / ! <AS> <SK> <KN> <AR> <BK>

Good lambic keying practice words to start with: KNOCK, CLOCK, FLOCK, LIKELY, BENS BEST BENT WIRE/5, BEST 73 (try for great rhythm on these last two)

- 1. Record your practice sessions (<u>Audacity</u> software, digital recorder, cellphone). Listen a few days or a week later and critique your rhythm, tempo, and word spacing.
- 2. Have fun, practice, improve. Poor head copy is OK your ICR skills will improve and your QSO partner doesn't really care. Poor sending is a bigger issue CW ops don't enjoy having QSOs with someone they can't copy.

How to practice: (find a code buddy too, schedule regular on-air QSOs)

- > Turn recorder ON
- Close your eyes, keep them closed while sending
- > Send at most accurate character speed, increase speed as you improve
- > Send the entire alphabet, work on having a consistent tempo
- > Send number scales: 0123456789098765432101234567890
- ➤ Select a <u>pangram</u>, send it during your practice. Memorize a pangram and head send it during every sending practice session (select a new pangram every week to ten days).
- Pangram Examples (memorize, send with eyes closed):
 - THE FIVE BOXING WIZARDS JUMP QUICKLY
 - O FIVE OR SIX BIG JET PLANES ZOOMED QUICKLY BY THE TOWER
 - THE QUICK BROWN FOX JUMPS OVER THE LAZY DOG
 - HOW QUICKLY DAFT JUMPING ZEBRAS VEX
 - FARMER JACK REALIZED THAT BIG YELLOW QUILTS WERE EXPENSIVE
 - WHEN ZOMBIES ARRIVE, QUICKLY FAX JUDGE PAT
 - BROWN JARS PREVENTED THE MIXTURE FROM FREEZING TOO QUICKLY
- Head send anything you can think of for a minute
- > Turn recorder OFF, save the recording (*File, Export* in Audacity)

Listen carefully to the unique sound of each character as you send — it will improve your character recognition skills. Vary your sending speeds; don't get in a rut. Try sending much faster than your most accurate speed occasionally (ignore errors during speed sending sessions).

Deliberately 'send' word spaces, <u>don't assume they're there</u> ('key up' is just as important as 'key down', especially after single letter words {A, I}).

lambic Keying descriptions:

C K N R '.' and <AR> are simple finger-first and thumb-first 'squeeze' characters

<AS> is a quick thumb-first squeeze followed by a thumb-hold

<AR> is a slightly shorter squeeze than a period '.'

<SK> is a thumb-hold followed by a squeeze

<KN> can be thought of as a 'Y' with a dit at the end

<BK> is a 'B' followed by a squeeze

F and L are thumb-holds with a finger tap, Q and Y: finger-holds with a thumb tap

N is a quick squeeze and release, finger touches first

lambic keying Q-Codes: QRL QRL? QRN QSY QSO QRM

<u>lambic keying helps automate these Punctuation Characters</u>: / . !

Thinking of a slash '/' as an 'F' with a dah in front of it may help you send it well

An exclamation point '!' <KW> is a finger-hold with two thumb taps

A period is a simple thumb-first squeeze
