THE NATIONAL CAPITAL RADIO AND TELEVISION MUSEUM

I had the opportunity to finally visit the National Capital Radio and Television Museum in Bowie, Maryland. Wish I'd gone sooner!

For a relatively small museum, it has a most impressive collection of every kind of radio, television, and other communication device throughout recent history. The museum volunteers have managed to fit the smallest radios on up through the largest televisions ever produced into their space. They have also set up interactive displays of radio devices, so it's not just a look and see experience. Be sure to play with the old battery tester that we used to see in stores.

Without telling my age, I instantly recognized the great floor model radios from the 1940's like the Philco my grandmother had in her dining room. Also saw several models of Admiral TVs, the likes of which our neighbor where I grew up used to sell and fix out of his garage store. But the real surprise for me was the great number of furniture designs used over the decades to hold the radio and TV components. Cabinets for both radios and TVs were elaborately carved from high quality woods and finished as very fine furniture. Don't miss the radio that looks like a baby grand piano! Many of these cabinets were extremely large and very heavy. A far cry from the great variety of transistor radios also displayed. Did you know that there is a Minion-designed transistor radio? Just from that, I can tell you that the museum's collection is not "static" but is very up-to-date and ever changing. They have a warehouse of donated items that they cannot display because of the limited space in the current museum. They do rotate displays.

As I entered the museum, which is an old 2-story farmhouse, I was met by one of the volunteer receptionists and a tour guide. The guide was very personable, thoroughly knew his material, and was glad to demonstrate the various pieces that still work beautifully. He

also took me down to the workshop that is on the grounds of the museum. I met two of the repairmen as well as the refinisher who work on all manner of radios to restore them to working condition. Needless to say, they have a full shop of projects, manuals, and parts. The men who make the repairs also teach classes on radio repair.

The museum also has a small library in its entrance. All the books in the library are for sale. I bought a book titled "TUBE, The Invention of Television," by authors David E. Fisher and Marshall Jon Fisher, copyright 1996. Since the books have been donated or acquired from previous owners, their prices are low. You won't be disappointed with the selection.


