POWER DISTRIBUTION PANEL

Ed Noell, KC3EN is lead on the Power Distribution Panel.

Note 2: "Quiet" generator (2kW inverter generator) is being rented from Jim's Aire in Prince Frederick. Ed and I will pick up this generator on Saturday morning, June 23.

Ed is also working on the generator donated to the club by Tom Rozenbroek. It has not been used in some time, hence the need to rent another reliable generator. If Tom's generator becomes reliably operational, we will cancel the rental from Jim's.

POWER/ELECTRICITY SOURCES

Includes: Generators, Deep Cycle 12v Batteries, HF RIG/Power Supply/MIC/Spare Fuses, VHF Satellite RIG/Power Supply/MIC/Spare Fuses, Extension Cords, Power Strips, Spare Fuses, Surge Protectors, 30w Oil,

GASOLINE/OTHER FUEL SOURCES [PROPRANE]

Includes: Gasoline, Propane, Gas Cans, Jerry Cans, Generator Oil, etc.

LIGHTING

Includes: 115v Lights, Desk lamps, Flashlights, Torches, Static electricity from your socks, etc.

RADIOS AND ACCESSORIES

Includes: Radios, Tuners, Power Supplies, Ground Rods, Microphones, Headsets, Adapters, Laptops, CW Keyers and Paddles, Transceivers, Antenna Tuners, VHF Station for Talk-in, APRS, etc.

ANTENNAE AND AUXILIARY ANTENNA EQUIPMENT

Note: If you have questions regarding antennas, please contact Steve N3IPN (Hempling).

Includes: Antennae (Dipoles and Verticals [ground independent preferred]), Antenna Supports/Poles/Towers, Antenna Insulators, Antenna Analyzers, Antenna Tuners, Slingshot and Fishing Reel, Feedline (50 or 75 ohm coax w/connectors both ends) and (450 ohm ladder line), Ropes and Pulleys, Tennis Ball Launchers, Air Compressor, Tools, etc.

MONITORING AND METERING EQUIPMENT

Includes: SWR Meters, Volt Ohmmeter, Battery Operated Clocks, Tool Kits, VOM, Analyzer, etc.

CABLES AND WIRES

Includes: Heavy Ground Wire, 50' RG-8 and 50' RG-58, Ground Rods, Short Coax with PL259's, Grounding Rods, Grounding Cables, Adapters – Coax and Audio, Electrical/Duct Tape

COMPUTERS AND AUXILLIARY EQUIPMENT

Includes: PC's and Monitors for Contest Logging, Laptop w/FD software, Printers, Surge Protectors, Headphones, Speakers, Keyers, Microphones, Inverter, and CIG Plug, CW Computer Interface

DATA RECORDING EQUIPMENT

Includes: Software, Blank Log Pages and Duplicate Sheets, Blank Paper, Pencils and Pens, Erasers, Battery Operated Clocks, Field Day Guidance, etc.

TOOLS

Includes: Any and Everything from Hairpins to Industrial Augers and Earth Movers

FURNITURE

Includes: Tables, Chairs, Speakers, Cots, etc.

FOOD AND SERVING EQUIPMENT

Includes: Food, Drinks, Coolers, Ice, Cups, Plates, Utensils, Napkins, Paper Towels, Trash Bags, Grills, Personal Pots and Pans, Plastic Food Containers for leftovers, Aluminum Foil, Plastic Wrap, Cleaning Supplies, etc.

Note: Please let me know if you can bring food and drinks. We have plenty of plates, cups, flatware, and napkins stored at Mount Hope. We also have a box of heavy duty trash bags at Mount Hope. I will collect all of that to bring to Broomes Island.

We also have a budget for Field Day. If I don't get much of a response on food, I will buy food and drinks that are appropriate for Field Day.

Also, please let me know if you can bring a grill. We usually have hamburgers and hot dogs, so a grill would really help.

PERSONAL PROTECTION/COMFORT EQUIPMENT
