I can't find my story on Comm Systems Corp, but I had a note from a guy who said that Comm Systems actually produced a few whole sets on the rusty tooling they bought from Stewart Warner, but the Army inspectors found them to be so bad that they were taken away and never issued. L@@K RARE!
