Impact Weather Briefing for: Wednesday, May 24, 2017

WATCHES/ADVISORIES: None at this time


OVERVIEW: Beginning late Wednesday afternoon and continuing into Thursday morning, a cold front will bring a chance of thunderstorms, some possibly severe, to South Florida. Any storm that becomes severe may produce damaging winds. Large hail is also possible, and an isolated tornado or two can't be ruled out. Locally heavy rainfall could lead to some isolated street flooding. The greatest risk for severe thunderstorms is north and west of an Everglades City to West Palm Beach line.

Severe Timing:

SW Florida/Lake Okeechobee: This evening through tonight

SE Florida: After midnight through sunrise Thursday

Gusty winds will lead to hazardous marine conditions, and a Small Craft Advisory is in effect for all South Florida waters. There's an increased risk for Rip Currents along Gulf beaches.
